We model and teach God's love for every person, and we help each student discover the Lord's plan for their life.

Peoria Notre Dame has a history of strong academic excellence. Our well-rounded curriculum develops our students to be leaders among their peers. They graduate with confidence, ready to pursue great achievements like other alumni such as Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, former U.S. Secretary of Transportation Ray LaHood, and Air Force Colonel Joanne MacGregor.

Most of our students go on to attend four year universities such as the University of Notre Dame, the University of Illinois, the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, and Washington University in St. Louis.

Our outstanding counseling department goes above and beyond to offer programs that guide students in college and career planning and provide emotional support along the way. Some of the services the department provides include

In the fall, the counseling department uniquely offers a post-high school planning workshop for seniors to help them prepare for life beyond high school. ### **Advanced Placement**

The Advanced Placement Program allows students to take higher level courses which may help them receive college credit and move ahead to more advanced classes in college. In some cases, AP exams with a score of 3 or greater may be accepted for college credit, helping students save time and money. In the spring of 2022, PND students performed exceptionally well with an average of 3.38. A score of 3 or greater indicates the student is achieving college-level work.







# GO FURTHER in the Community




Every Peoria Notre Dame student participates in the Christian Service Program and completes at least 100 hours of service prior to graduation. Each separate project must meet a minimum time committment of 20 hours. The class of 2022 alone has completed nearly 16,000 hours of service to residents living within Peoria and surrounding communities.

All Christian Service Projects are connected to at least one of the Corporal or Spiritual Works of Mercy. Each project brings the student into direct service with one or more individuals. This interaction allows students to see and experience the impact they are making on others in the community.

During the Advent season, Peoria Notre Dame students participate in a Christmas Basket Drive to provide meals for local families in need. Students host 16 evening basket drives in various neighborhoods to collect food items. More than 85% of the student body attends one of these events. As a result, students fill 400 boxes with more than 50 items in each box. Due to the efforts of our students, 25,000 items are distributed to families in need right in the Peoria area each Christmas.







At Peoria Notre Dame, students are challenged to go beyond the school walls and get involved in the community. Many students choose to participate in monthly Service Saturdays or serve local nonprofits and organizations such as Sophia's Kitchen, South Side Mission, and Wildlife Prairie Park.
