ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

- **Rigorous trimester system uniquely prepares students for college**
- **Accelerated academic solid courses are completed in two trimesters allowing students the opportunity to explore additional course options beyond traditional graduation requirements**
- **Differentiated college preparatory instructional levels are available including regular, college preparatory and honors**
- **GPA is calculated on a 4.0 weighted scale**
- **Students are ranked by their GPA; exact ranks and GPA are provided to colleges on all student transcripts**
- **50 Honors courses available**
- **Foreign language options include Latin, Spanish, and French**

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

- **23 Advanced Placement (AP) courses**
- **27 additional Honors courses prepare students for AP testing, but without official AP designation**
- **8 Dual Credit and 4 Early College online options are available through partnership with Illinois Central College**
- **82% of students who took AP exams in the spring of 2023 scored a 3 or greater**

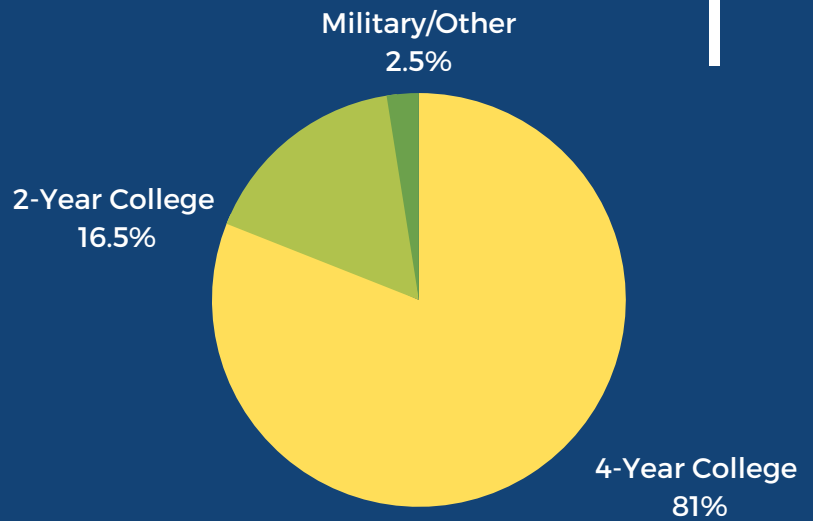
