ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

- **Rigorous semester system uniquely prepares students for college**
- **Two-week Winterim period allowing students to explore additional interests beyond traditional graduation requirements as well as internship and service opportunities**
- **Differentiated college preparatory instructional levels are available including college preparatory and honors**
- **GPA is calculated on a 4.0 weighted scale**
- **Students are ranked by GPA; ranks and GPA are provided to colleges on student transcripts**
- **Beginning with the Class of 2028, Latin honors - Summa Cum Laude: 4.25 and above | Magna Cum Laude: 3.8-4.24 | Cum Laude: 3.35-3.79**

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

- **18 Advanced Placement (AP) courses offered**
- **20 additional Honors courses prepare students for AP testing, but without official AP designation**
- **5 Dual Credit and 4 Early College online options are available through partnership with Illinois Central College**
- **82% of students who took AP exams in the spring of 2024 scored a 3 or greater**

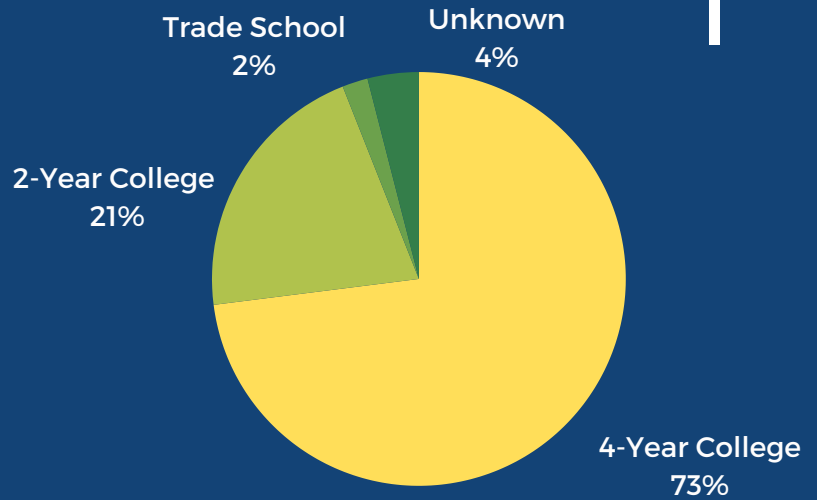
